
Psalm 2

God Responded to Human Rebellion by Promising to Send His Son to Be Our King

- The whole world rebelled against God (verses 1-3)
- God's response includes laughter and sending His Son, Jesus, to be our King (verses 4-9)
- All nations are invited to submit to King Jesus (verses 10-12)

Celebrate What's Already True in Christ's Kingdom and Anticipate What's Coming

- The psalm highlights the Kingship of Jesus throughout His first and second Advents
- Celebrate what's true "already" because of the First Advent (Revelation 12:5, Acts 1:8)
- Anticipate what's "not yet" until the Second Advent (Revelation 19:11-16)
